Black History Month

The Negro Spiritual is a religious folk song created by the African slaves in the US. These folk songs told stories from the Bible or shared the experiences of the composer(s). Sometimes they have dual meanings. One duality occurs in "Wade In De Water" where it is believed that the spiritual contained directions for escaped slaves to use the rivers and streams to hide their scents from dogs who were after them. "You Betta Mind" was sung to remind the people that were mistreating them, that there is a judgment day where all will have to give account of their actions. Even though we profess to be Christian, there is a day when we will stand before God and He will judge our lives. The folk songs were not scored (written down), but handed down verbally from one generation to another. This new music fused African music traditions with European music traditions to create a new genre that is the father of many popular genres today such as: gospel, blues, ragtime, soul, R *B and rap.
